

Camp COVID-19 Protocol

We are very excited to be able to offer camp for the 2022 season. Due to the continuing COVID-19 situation, we are following enhanced health guidelines this year to keep campers and staff as safe as possible. Please review the information below for our Camp COVID-19 Protocols.

BEFORE CAMP:

- Monitor your camper's health in the two weeks prior to arriving at camp.
 - Is your camper showing signs or symptoms of illness?
 - Fever of 100.4 F or greater
 - Sore throat
 - Cough
 - Difficulty breathing
 - Diarrhea or vomiting
 - New onset of severe headache, especially with a fever
 - Has your camper tested positive for COVID-19? Or,
 - Has your camper been in close contact with anyone who has tested positive for COVID-19?

If so, please contact us before coming to camp. Please keep campers at home if they are sick.

AT ARRIVAL:

- Upon arriving at camp, all campers will complete a health screening to check for signs of illness.
- If campers look or report feeling unwell, a camp staff member will assess symptoms and take their temperature. Campers who have a temperature of 100.4 F or greater will not be allowed to sign into camp.

DURING CAMP:

- Campers will be monitored by staff for signs and symptoms of illness.
 - If a camper becomes symptomatic while at camp, they will be sent home immediately. We will provide care in the health office until they are picked up.
- Campers will be encouraged to wash hands frequently or use sanitizer before and after activities.
- Campers will not be required to wear a mask. We will support campers and staff who choose to wear masks.
- If a camper or a staff person tests positive for COVID-19, the Camp must follow quarantine and isolation guidance for all campers and staff persons. It is possible that the Camp will need to close. This determination will be based on guidance from our local health department.

AFTER CAMP:

- Please watch for signs and symptoms of illness, and if your camper tests positive for COVID-19 up to two weeks after camp, please let us know.
