Special services are coordinated if families have concerns about a developmental delay.

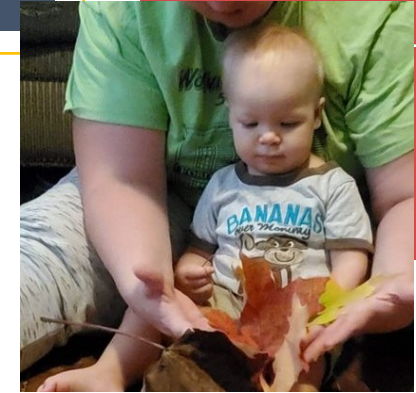

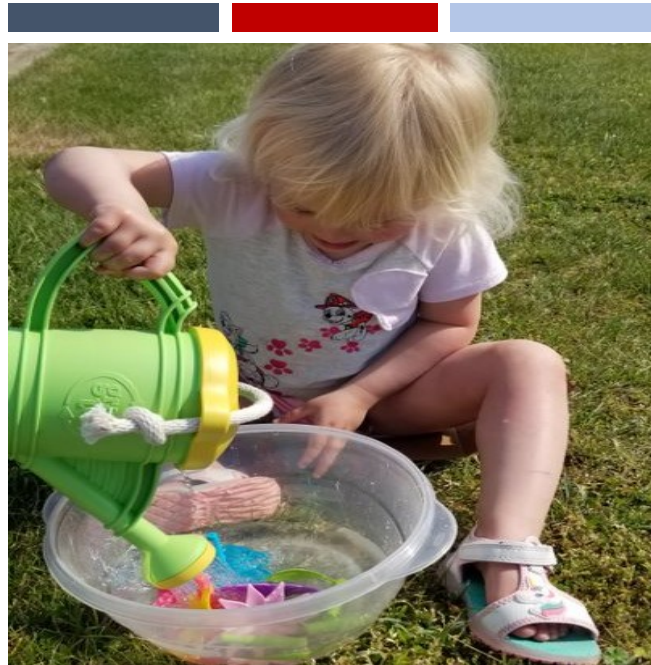
